The Falcon Learning Lab is designed to support student success in grades K-8. Students experience a warm, rich learning environment focused on their continuous growth. They may need ongoing assistance to master a set of skills or extra support to provide the self-advocacy skills necessary to be successful learners. Ms. Bona, Learning Lab specialist, has a passion for guiding students to success. She stated, "I absolutely love working in the Learning Lab... it is a joy to watch the students grow academically but also socially and emotionally." One parent commented, "Our child started going to the Learning Lab on a weekly basis for extra support in math and reading to give her a boost. This one on one attention provided her with the extra boost." Finally, Mr. Gallivan reported, "This spring I reviewed 14 student NWEA MAP assessments results and found that those receiving help from Ms. Bona averaged an increase of 14 RIT points on their math and reading scores." 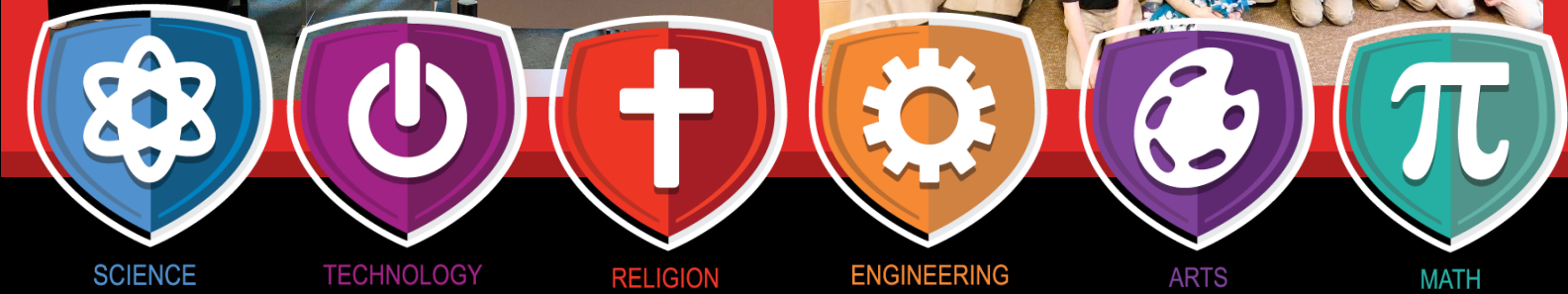


SERVICE

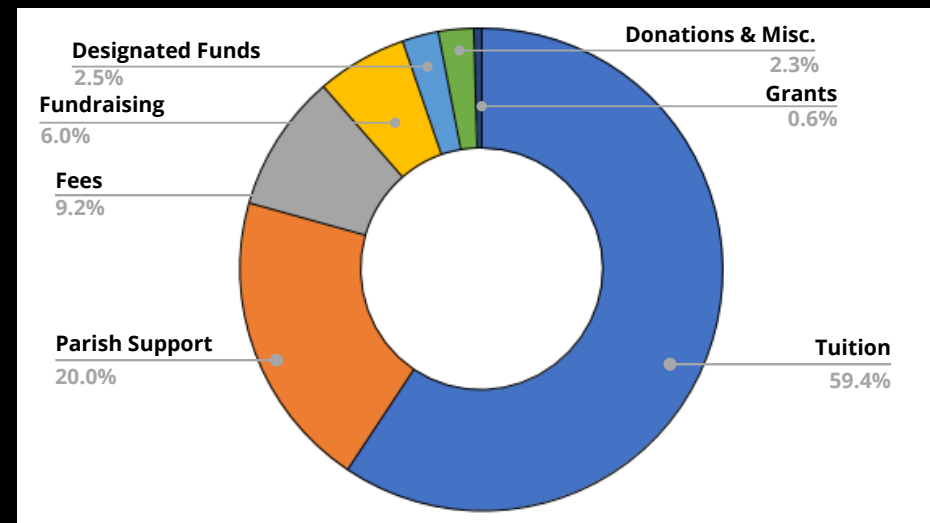
Dear Frassati Family and Community,

Student progress is measured twice a year and their scores are made up of subtests which are identified in their reports. MAP scores help teachers as they plan instruction for individual students. We recognize and celebrate the individual growth that happens in each child and we are proud of the overall academic growth pattern we see from 3rd through 8th grade.
