Fall 2019 Preschool Survey Summary:

Respondents: 43

42 of 43 (97.7%) felt that there was a need for a high quality preschool in our community.

17 families have children who attend preschool.

5 families have children who attend childcare.

12 families are stay at home.

7 Other (some are finished with preschool others not yet old enough.

57% of respondents want a full-day option. 43% of respondents want a half-day option.

87% of respondants prefer a Faith-Based program. 20% prefer the school district program.

Top three program times chosen:

- 1. All Day M-W-F (7:35am-2:00pm)
- 2. Half Day M-W-F (8:00-11:00am)
- 3. All Day M-F School Year Only tied with Year Round

Top four ranked in importance when selecting a preschool.

- 1. Faith-Based Education
- 2. Developmental Appropriateness
- 3. Teacher Qualifications
- 4. Cost
