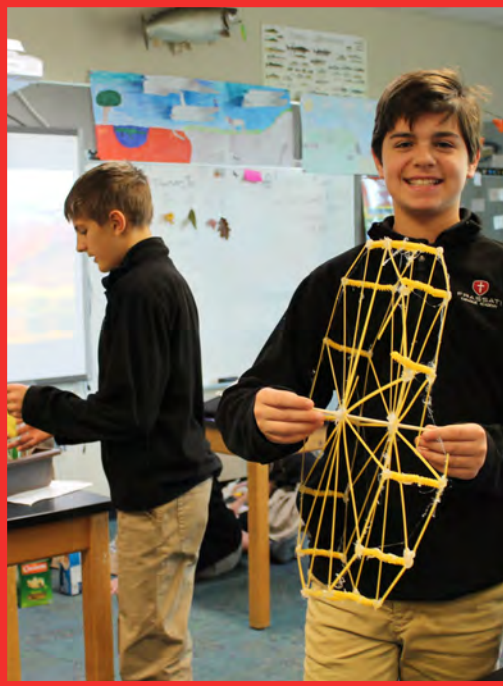

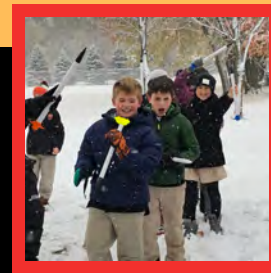

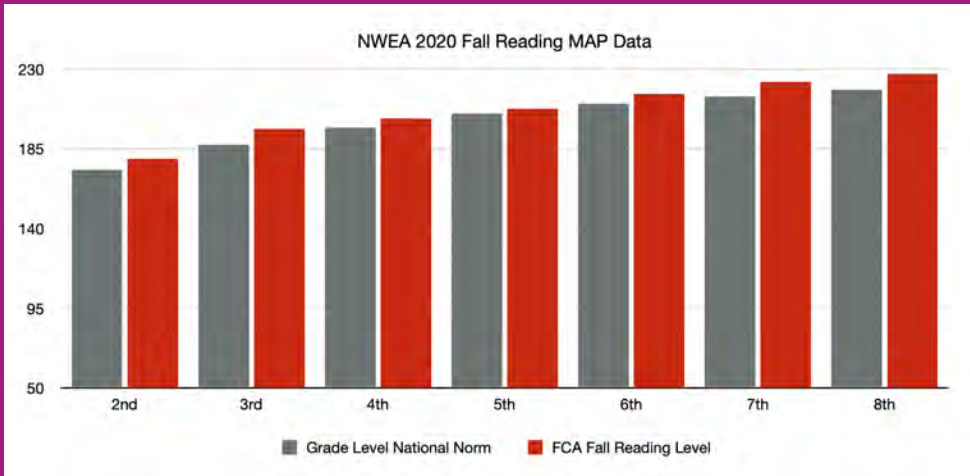

The Academic Experience

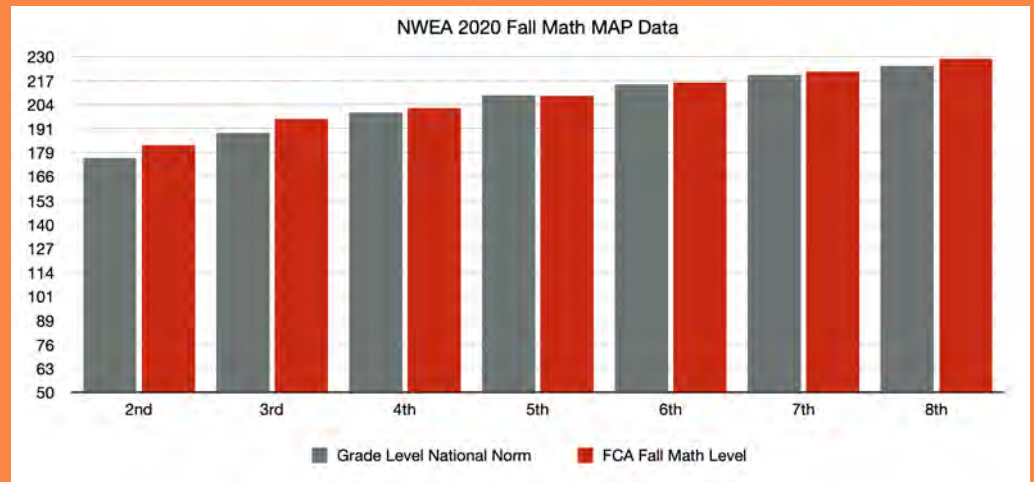
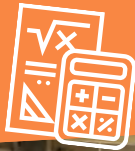

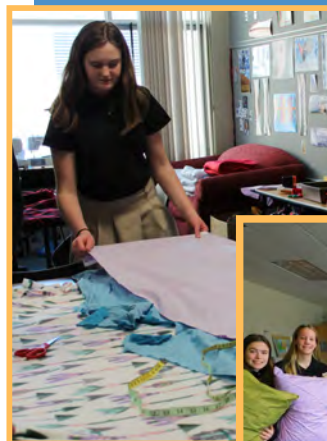


Students in Mrs. Urban's middle school religion classes learn about the Catholic faith, including their call to serve others.

Please note that this is an annual project. The pictures displayed are from December 2019.

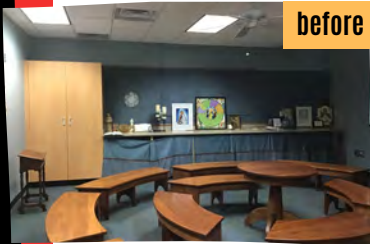

BELIEVE & READ

We are thrilled to announce that in June 2020, the Catholic Schools Center of Excellence (CSCOCE) selected Frassati Catholic Academy to be a host school for the highly praised Believe & Read program. Believe and Read will enhance and enrich the literacy instruction of our students. Specially trained coaches from Groves Academy, a national expert in reading instruction, will mentor our Frassati teachers over a three-year period. Frassati teachers will share these lessons with our students, including daily 30-minute phonics-based lessons, helping our young readers grasp the reading rules to make them the best readers they can be. The coaches from Groves Academy will work with our K-2 teachers in 2020-21 and K-3 starting in 2021-22. The specialized training provided to our faculty will transform literacy instruction for students at Frassati Catholic Academy for years to come. We are grateful to CSOCE for selecting Frassati for this exciting initiative and for making it available at no cost to the school.

CHAPEL OF THE BEATITUDES

In late 2019, leadership of Frassati and St. Mary of the Lake decided to convert the second-floor Sacred Space into a chapel for celebration of the Mass and reservation of the Blessed Sacrament. Frassati families and friends helped fund this initiative at the 2020 Spring Gala by purchasing liturgical items, such as chairs, the tabernacle, chalice, vestments, statues and other artwork. Parishioners of St. Mary of the Lake and St. Pius X also contributed time, talent and treasure to this project. Together, we raised \$74,000 for the chapel, which is nearly complete.

We look forward to Archbishop Hebda visiting the school, celebrating Mass, consecrating the altar and blessing the chapel. In the meantime, our staff and students visit the chapel for prayer.

FRASSATI ANNUAL FUND

In early 2020, a generous supporter of Catholic Schools kicked off the creation of the Frassati Annual Fund with a gift of \$100,000. The purposes of the Fund are to keep tuition affordable, support the continued development of our faculty and staff, and provide financial assistance to families who desire a Catholic education for their children. Thanks to the generosity of the parishioners of St. Mary of the Lake, St. Pius X, and other supporters of our school, the Frassati Annual Fund continues to grow and impact day-to-day operations in significant ways.



FRASSATI ENDOWMENT FUND

Shortly after the launch of the Frassati Annual Fund, another loyal supporter reached out and offered a gift of \$75,000 to begin an endowment fund. The Catholic Community Foundation matched that initial donation with a gift of \$25,000.
